

A Word From Your Priest



Summer is coming and we have a lot of things going on here at Trinity I wanted to let you know about.

To begin with, we are continuing to work on ways to boost our youth presence. In addition to family activities and Sunday School we want to continue to involve our kids in our regular worship.



You may have already noticed an increase in our Acolyte participation! Thank you to Scott Ramsay for his continued work on the schedule and training for new Acolytes. As soon as we can get a relatively stable rotation, we also want to look at upgrading and replacing some of the vestments for the Acolytes. We are considering including albs (white robes) and season specific cinctures (ropes) as a part of the look. If you are interested in serving as an Acolyte, please let me or Scott Ramsay know. Scheduling is hard and we know the demands are great, so we all have to work together to make this a success.



In addition to the Acolyte program, I am initiating a children's minute to the Sunday worship starting June 4, 2016. This is a time, after the Collect, and before the readings, that all the kids can come down front with me for a minute to learn something about God and our church. Then the Sunday School age kids will leave with Liz Ramsay for Sunday School.

Finally, we are working on the possibility of having some opportunities this summer for the kids to sing during the church service. Look for more on this real soon. In order for this to be a success it will require support from the parents to help us schedule and to help the kids practice the songs at home, too.

Speaking of singing this summer, we have a couple of plans in the works. The first is a summer choir. Paul Miller has agreed to help me coordinate this, so if you are interested in singing, always wanted to, or just willing to try, let me or Paul know. We already have a few folks and there is certainly room for more.



In addition (or maybe as a way to recruit for the summer choir) we are going to have an old fashioned hymn sing on June 12, 2016 at 5:00 pm. These should be Gospel songs that a lot of you are familiar with. We will meet in the Church for about an hour for prayers, scripture, and songs and then move to Trinity Hall for a fried chicken dinner. The Church will supply the chicken and sides, and lemonade but I am asking the participants to bring a dessert.



Last but not least, we are working to build on our health ministries and in reach to our fellow parishioners. We are in the process of discerning how the Spirit is leading Trinity in this regard. We are thinking of using the name "Parish Health Ministries" so that it encompasses all that we

are already doing, such as the Healing Services, Parish Nurse Ministry, Mustard Seeds, and individual efforts that often go unnoticed. So if you have any ideas or thoughts in this regard or are willing to participate, please let me know.

We have a lot of exciting things going on. Please, come and be a part of what God is doing here at Trinity, and as always, bring a friend.

From the children's area.....





Our dear former parishioner Laverne Marshall has asked me to write about her disease for The Trinity Times, to share with her beloved Trinity family the facts of this rare disease, and, maybe to provide some helpful education for US.

Creutzfeldt-Jakob (KROITS-felt YAH-kobe) disease is a degenerative brain disorder that leads to dementia and, ultimately, death. Symptoms of Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease (CJD) can resemble those of other dementia-like brain disorders, such as Alzheimer's. But Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease usually progresses much more rapidly.

CJD captured public attention in the 1990s when some people in the United Kingdom developed a form of the disease — variant CJD (vCJD) — after eating meat from diseased cattle. However, classic" Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease hasn't been linked to contaminated beef.

Although serious, CJD is rare, and vCJD is the least common form. Worldwide, there is an estimated one case of CJD diagnosed per million people each year, most often in older adults.

Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease is marked by rapid mental deterioration, usually within a few months. Initial signs and symptoms typically include: personality changes, anxiety, depression, memory loss, impaired thinking, blurred vision or blindness, insomnia, difficulty speaking, difficulty swallowing, sudden, ierkv movements.

As the disease progresses, mental symptoms worsen. Most people eventually lapse into a coma.

Heart failure, respiratory failure, pneumonia or other infections are generally the cause of death. Death usually occurs within a year.

Once again, Laverne wants everyone to know how much she appreciates all the cards, flowers, and visits from her Trinity family. She is not able to write and thank everyone and, since she has difficulty speaking, she is unable to call her friends. Her address is:


