This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

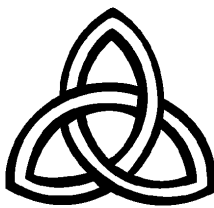

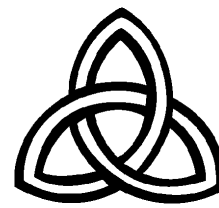
